Attendance at Lismore High

We all have a collective responsibility to maximise every students learning with regular attendance. It is not within DoE guidelines for students to attend non-essential appointments such as hairdressers within school time, this includes Wednesday sport. We are unable to give permission for students to have lunch downtown or to leave early to go to paid work. The school has a responsibility to not endorse any leave pass that does not meet guidelines and parents/carers have a responsibility to provide an explanation within seven days from the first day of any absence. Within the 'Guidelines for Supporting Student Attendance' it is stated that:



Regular attendance and engagement in educational programs is strongly linked to the likelihood of students experiencing success in learning. Students who have poor patterns of attendance are at risk of not achieving their potential and are disadvantaged in the quality of choices they are able to make in later life.

Such learners may be:

- Socially isolated and experience bullying and harrassment
- At risk of harm during times of absence by being more likely to be involved in socially unacceptable and/or illegal activities
- Have gaps in their knowledge and understanding of basic concepts
- More likely to leave school at a younger age
- Over-represented in the juvenile justice system
- At risk due to welbeing and possible child protection issues.

Study Skills: What is the best way to study?

Students sometimes ask "What is the best way to study?" There is no one best way; an important lesson for students to learn is that everyone learns in different ways, everyone has different approaches and preferences, and what works well for one person may not work well for another. This truth applies to all aspects of effective learning – time management, research skills, writing skills and so on.

There are certainly good techniques and strategies that apply in all of these areas, and also approaches that work well for the majority of students. However it is essential that all students try different techniques to see what works best for them. Preferences could also change over time, so it makes sense to at least once a year stop and reflect on approaches to learning: what you did, what worked, what didn't, what you should change, what you should keep, and new things you could try.

This is what 'metacognition' is all about. It means taking the time to try and understand more about the process of learning and your role as a learner. Students who take a metacognitive approach to their learning are much more likely to improve their results. How can you find out different study techniques to try? Talk to the people around you – friends, siblings, parents – ask them what techniques they have used. Also ask your teachers what they would recommend for their subject.

You can also visit the unit on the Study Skills Handbook that covers how to study for tests and exams. You will find lots of active studying strategies and grids to help you plan for exams. Just remember – there is a worst way to study – just reading your notes over and over and hoping the information stays in your head!

LET THEM SPEAK

Give them time and space to talk, and avoid interrupting them.



REMOVE DISTRACTIONS

Put away your phone and give them your full attention.



ACKNOWLEDGE THEIR FEELINGS

Respond with comments like 'That must have been hard' or 'Sounds like it was exciting'.



GIVE PHYSICAL CUES

Nodding, making eye contact and facing the person you're talking with show that you're really listening.



PLAN FOR LATER

Ask them if they'd like to chat about the issue again, and lock it in.
