
Expect to hear some Jingeelaa (hello) and yaway and yugambee (yes and no) as well as bugalbee (thank you) in your travels through the year.

#### FIT FOR SERVICE PROGRAM NSW POLICE

During Term 1, students from the The Rivers Secondary College Lismore High Campus will be engaging in the Fit for Service program run by the Richmond LAC Police Department here at the Lismore High Campus and other venues in the region.

This program is targeted at young persons aged 14-18 years who are interested in joining any of the services including, Police, SES and the Armed Services. The program will focus on educating and preparing the students for a pathway into these services. Other skills that will be targeted are team building, individual confidence, communication, punctuality, respect, leadership and general fitness, health and wellbeing.

One of the main outcomes for this program is to provide the opportunity for the students to gain knowledge, preparation and insight into government and Armed Services. The program engaged the students with members of the different services through mentoring, open, field and recruitment days and allowed the students a sneak peek into the variety of government and armed services available to them.

One of the main arms of the Program was designed around the testing protocols for National / State based services i.e. NSW Police, NSW Ambulance, NSW Fire and Rescue, Australian Army, Navy and Air Force. Not only did the students get to complete fitness assessments but they were also able to speak with staff employed in the various services.

The activities are aimed at improving the physical fitness and overall wellbeing of the students by introducing fitness drills each week including specific fitness levels and introduce participants to the reasons fitness is one of the main key ingredients to success in the services. Pre and post fitness testing of the students and the chance to test themselves against police members will allow the students to see were they are at with their fitness. They will learn how to complete the fitness test exercises correctly and more importantly learned how to work as a team, encourage each other and attain goals.

For the students from Lismore High Campus, Fit For Service will be an extremely beneficial program.

Fit For Service is a unique program that provides a valuable insight into the many services that are available to our students. Having the hands on activities, the staff providing specific career related details and a variety of activities will keep the students engaged and interested for the duration of the program.

#### **Medical Information**

The school is also updating our student's medical information and updating any health care plans. We welcome information from parents about your child's health, even if you are not requesting specific support from our school. Our school asks for medical information when you enrol your child. It is also important that you let us know if your child's health care needs change or if a new health condition develops. Information about allergies, medical conditions such as asthma and diabetes and other health care related issues (including prior conditions such as medical procedures in the last 12 months) should be provided to the school by parents. Please provide this information in writing to the principal. This will greatly assist our school in planning to support your child's health and wellbeing.

**Students Leaving Early for Appointments** 

Please send your student to school with a note in the morning requesting early collection. Students are to present the note to Student Services before roll call (8.30 to 9.10am). Student will be issued with a leaver's pass which can then be shown to their class teacher to release them at the appropriate time (failing this procedure, time spent finding the student may leave you late for your appointment).

Students will wait in Student Services until parents advise (6621 5185) they are waiting in the visitors carpark (College Street entrance) outside the office. Students will not be allowed to wait at the bus bay for collection.

**Emergency collection or messages to students throughout the** day - unfortunately this sometimes happens and we request all calls be made by 2pm as we cannot guarantee delivery of messages after this time.

Permission notes and money will only be accepted in Student Services before school (8.30am to 9.10am), recess and lunch. Notes will not be accepted without payment. If paying online please write the receipt number on the permission note.

#### **ADMINSTRATION NEWS**

#### **School Contributions**

Lismore High Campus request a general and sometimes a subject-specific contribution to enhance our educational programs. There will be no charge to access the minimum curriculum as defined in the Education Act 1990, however, our request for a voluntary contribution for elective subjects is to fund the learning that go beyond the minimum requirements of the curriculum. NSW Government policy is that school contributions are voluntary. The contributions for elective subjects are used to purchase materials or equipment necessary to undertake the subject. Where a student has not paid their subject contribution, they may be allowed to participate in the lesson but will not be able to consume the product in the case of food-based subjects or keep the item for manufacturing subjects.

Parents and carers who are unable to pay elective subject contributions because of financial hardship may be eligible for assistance from the campus. It is not the aim of the school to disadvantage students in anyway. However, payment of fees is crucial. If you are unable to pay subject contributions because of financial hardship, please contact our School Administration Manager Mrs Cheryl Graham, so we can arrange terms of payment or other financial support.

For 2023 subject fees are able to be paid from your Hardship Flood Funding, to do this you will need to provide details in writing either by note or email— lismore-h.school@det.nsw.edu.au

### **Making Payments**

The Student Service office is where all payments are received for excursions, contributions etc. Students are able to make payments at the Student Service office before school, at recess and at lunchtime.

The closing date for payment of money for campus excursions and events is clearly specified on the student permission note. After this date no further payments will be accepted and students will not be able to attend the excursion or event. It is important that students develop responsibility for making sure that they have paid on time (and also returned their permission note).

#### **Online Payments**

It is now possible for parents to make online payments to the campus for amounts owing for students, via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Payments can be made using either a Visa or MasterCard credit or debit card. The payment page is accessed from the front page of the campus' website by selecting 'Make a Payment'. Items that can be paid include voluntary school contributions, subject contributions, major excursions and sport.

Student and payment details are entered each time you make a payment and are not held within the payment system. The payment system is hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/debit card details are captured in a secure manner, these details are not passed back to the school.

You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before the payment is processed. Details of the payments are passed daily to the school where they will be receipted against your child's account. As a receipt has been issued from the payment page a further receipt will not be issued by the school. For accuracy of matching up payments please provide student name and reference. For any enquiries regarding the Online Payment process please contact the School Administration Office.

# **Back to School Bus Safety**

With the school holidays coming to an end and students heading back to school this week, motorists are asked to make safe driving their number-one priority.

#### For motorists

 School zones are now back in force. Reduced speed limits and additional demerit points apply.



- Sticking to the speed limit and following the road rules in school zones.
- You must also slow down to 40km/h when bus lights are flashing.
- Lights flash on buses to warn motorists that buses are picking up and dropping off children.
- Looking out for children crossing the road near bus stops, in school zones or along bus routes.
- Giving way to buses when they merge back into traffic.

## For parents

 Never drop off or meet your child on the opposite side of the road to the bus stop or call them across the road.

## Rural and regional school travel

Apply online for free school travel in rural and regional NSW. You only need to complete one form, even for journeys using more than one operator.

## Who can apply?

To be eligible for free school travel, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

#### Years K-2 (Infants)

There is no minimum distance.

#### Years 3-6 (Primary)

More than 1.6km straight line distance or at least 2.3km walking.

#### Years 7-12 (Secondary)

More than 2.0km straight line distance or at least 2.9km walking.

## Who needs to apply

You only need to apply if the student has never been approved for free school travel before. Students in a shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody) should submit a separate application for both addresses.

## How to update your details

You need to update student details online if the student is changing their name, address, school or campus, or their Transport operator. You can update them at transportnsw.info/ssts-update

## Frequently asked questions

Does the approved free travel include travel outside school hours?

Approved free school travel is only for travel to and from school. So for travel after hours, on weekends or during school holidays, students will need to buy a ticket.

What if there's no public transport in my area?

In areas where there is no public transport, you may be able to get a subsidy for driving the student to school. For details, visit transportnsw.info/school-students

How do I apply if the student needs to travel from two addresses because the parents live separately?

Each parent (or the student if aged 16 or over) needs to apply separately for each address. The same minimum distances apply.

## How to apply for free travel for the first time

You can apply for free school travel for next year from the start of Term 4 this year.

#### Step 1

Once you have enrolled your child at the new school, apply online by giving your home address and telling us which bus company the student needs to travel with between home and school. You can apply online at transportnsw.info/school-students

#### Step 2

The school then confirms to us that your details are correct.

#### Step 3

We will then work on your application. You will get an email confirming if the student is approved for free travel. If so, we will tell your local bus company who may send a school travel pass (if needed) to your school or, in some cases, the bus company will contact you directly about travel arrangements.

A parent or guardian must apply for students aged 15 years and under, Students who are 16 years and over must apply for themselves.
