BYOD Device Requirements

Wireless connectivity:

High schools: The department's Wi-Fi network installed in high schools operates on the **802.11n 5Ghz standard**. Devices that do not support this standard will not be able to connect.

Primary schools: The department's Wi-Fi network installed in primary schools operates on the **802.11n 5Ghz standard**. Devices that do not support this standard will not be able to connect.

Note: There may be some variation to this standard in primary schools. The IT delegate in the school will be able to provide details.

Operating system:

The current or prior version of any operating system.

Software and apps:

School-based requirements. All software and apps should be fully updated.

Battery life:

A minimum of 5hrs battery life to last the school day.

Memory and RAM:

A minimum specification of 16 GB storage and 2 GB RAM to process and store data effectively.

Hardware features:

Camera and microphone.

Ergonomics:

Reasonable sized screen and a sturdy keyboard to enable continuous use throughout the day.

Other considerations

Casing: Tough and sturdy to avoid breakage.

Weight: Lightweight for ease of carrying.

Durability: Durable and strong.

Accessories

Carry case: Supply a carry case or skin to protect the device.

Insurance and warranty: Be aware of the terms of insurance policies/warranties for the device. The school will not accept responsibility for loss or breakage.

Back-up storage: Consider a portable hard drive as an appropriate source of back-up storage for essential documents.

BYOD Student Responsibilities

Operating system and anti-virus:

Students must ensure they have a legal and licensed version of a supported operating system and of software. If applicable, students' devices must be equipped with anti-virus software.

NSW Department of Education and Communities' Wi-Fi network connection only:

Student devices are only permitted to connect to the department's Wi-Fi network while at school. There is no cost for this service.

Battery life and charging:

Students must ensure they bring their device to school fully charged for the entire school day. *No charging equipment will be supplied by the school.*

Theft and damage:

Students are responsible for securing and protecting their devices at school. *Any loss or damage to a device is not the responsibility of the school or the Department.*

Confiscation:

Students' devices may be confiscated if the school has reasonable grounds to suspect that a device contains data which breaches the BYOD Student Agreement.

Maintenance and support:

Students are solely responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of their devices.

Ergonomics:

Students should ensure they are comfortable using their device during the school day particularly in relation to screen size, sturdy keyboard etc.

Data back-up:

Students are responsible for backing-up their own data and should ensure this is done regularly.

Insurance/warranty:

Students and their parents/caregivers are responsible for arranging their own insurance and should be aware of the warranty conditions for the device.

Device Specifications

The BYOD programme is new, but your device doesn't have to be.

If you have an existing device and it meets the minimum specification requirements, then you are welcome to use it at school.

In some cases, your existing device may only need the addition of a new USB Wi-Fi adapter to make it compatible on the school network!

If you do require the purchase of a new device, it is recommended that you have a copy of the minimum requirements on hand as different operating systems and device types have different capabilities. There are some base features that are mandatory for all devices to ensure the device is capable for learning activities.

Please be advised that mobile phones, iPods and tablets with a display smaller than 9.7" are not appropriate as a primary device for BYOD.



BASE REQUIREMENTS

Display

Minimum 9.7" display

Display should be no larger than 13.3" as this has an adverse effect on weight and battery life. Ideal size is 11".

Display resolution will not affect learning activities.

Touchscreen input not required for learning activities.

Weight (recommendation)

Aim for a device UNDER 1.5-2kg, or a weight you are comfortable carrying around each day. Remember you will be carrying this and potentially some books in your bag each day.

Physical Keyboard

Device must have a physical keyboard for data entry.

USB/Bluetooth Mount not required but can be beneficial.

Tablet devices using aftermarket keyboards may affect battery life.

WiFi

Minimum:

802.11n (5GHz). Also referred to as Dual Band a/b/g/n

Recommended:


Dual Band (2.4GHz/5GHz) 802.11ac.

Battery Life

Minimum 6 hours

Device is expected to be charged at home each day. Facilities will not be available to charge the device during school hours.

Other Considerations

- System life expectancy is 4 years (not including physical damage/wear and tear). Meaning that students entering year 7 can utilise any device, but may require a new one entering senior years.
- Depending on senior electives, a year 7 device could be used through until graduation. Purchasing a solid, robust device will assist in the device's survival.
- Students entering year 9-12 need to consider their electives and the software requirements when selecting a device for school.
- Extended warranties are often available, and insurance for your device can also be found and applied when purchasing a new device. Check all the terms and conditions to ensure what is included/covered and always make a decision based on your personal circumstances.

Accessories

- Specialised back pack: with Laptop/Tablet compartment for added protection.
- Carry Case: A protective case to house the device is highly recommended.
- Tablet case with integrated keyboard.
- Additional storage: An external HDD may be desirable in some circumstances, either to supplement a small internal HDD or as a backup for data not saved online.

Students need to go to the Network settings on their laptop and locate the network detnsw They must enter their allocated username@detnsw followed by their password to successfully connect to the internet.

If there are any problems the student will need to speak to the class teacher or the TSO in the Library.




Google Chrome is the preferred internet browser at Lismore Campus, this is the access portal for almost all in class activities, projects and take home assessments.
